## **BP/Worlds Style Debate**:

There will be one division of BP debate open to any level of competitor. A list or rules and regulations for this style will be provided at the training session. The rounds will consist of 4 teams (Opening Government, Closing Government, Opening Opposition, Closing Opposition). There will be a panel of judges in each round that will collaborate on raking of the round. Preparation time will be 20 minutes and each speech will be 7 minutes. The topics and start time for BP debate will be the same for Parliamentary debate. There will be a central announcement of the topics.
